

#### Must meet one of the following criteria:

- 18 years/older or,
- Married or.
- Military Veteran or,
- At least 1 dependent
- \* Must meet household income requirements by HUD.
- \* W9s are required from Landlord.
- \* Tenants must reside in the 4 counties: Clarendon, Lee, Kershaw or Sumter
- \* Unit inspections are required.
- \* 1 year lease required. Month to month not accepted.
- \* Up to \$500 assistance for 12 months.
